First Communion Class

First Communion classes began on Sunday, March 16th, following worship (10:45) in the library. With the use of the resource "Fed and Forgiven",





individual sessions focus on the Bible Story and Big Idea, explore the many meanings of Holy Communion, and coordinate with individual learner resources for PreK-K, Grades 1-3, Grades 4-6, and older youth. The classes last 4 weeks, plus an additional fifth class to gather in the

kitchen and make communion bread together with Pastor Andrea. The bread they all make together will be used during worship at **6:30pm** on Maundy Thursday, April 17th, the day of their First Communion.

Happenings at GAP

The beginning of the year has been quite busy for GAP. In January and February, the various ministries handed out and served lots of individuals. 1,872 individual received food, 474 were provided prescription assistance and the period project, adult incontinence, and diapers were going strong. In fact the millionth diaper was dispensed. That's right 1,000,000 diapers have been handed out to needy families! That is a lot of diapers. Of great importance are the 164 birth certificates received. This is the first step to a valid ID for those who have had their ID lost or stolen. Shelters will not accept you without ID. So this is a critical service provided.

A survey of visits to GAP in 2024 revealed that the following distribution of clients served. In the food pantry, 2,092 households (4,334 individuals) were served. The largest age group served was under the age of 18 (35%). Of those served 53% were male and 47% female. Thirty-six of the clients had no home. Of high importance was that 76% of these clients were served only 1-5 times in the year. Therefore the overwhelming majority of those seeking help from GAP are doing so very infrequently suggesting a need for help when only when a month is short. Thus, the majority are not relying on GAP to consistently place food on the table. Indeed only 2% were seen at GAP more than 30 times in the year. This trend also was seen with those seeking prescription drug assistance where 78% of clients were served only 2-5 times a year.

In addition to the ministries, GAP is providing a location for those being served by agencies to have a mailbox location. Government agencies and other nonprofit services require a mailing address for their clients. Individuals can apply to the various agencies in town to receive access through the agency to a mailing address. The Homeless Task Force paid for the mailboxes and will work with individuals for access to them.



The support provided by Advent is very much appreciated. Those wishing to volunteer their time will find opportunities on Wednesday mornings packaging diapers and adult incontinence products and Thursdays when the food bank is open. Feel free to talk to Gina Hammock if you want more information.

The Little Free Pantry Ministry is Alive and Well.

Praise God! Thank you to so many of you who are involved in the Little Free Pantry ministry here at Advent. Whether you bring in supplies, donate funds, or help to keep the pantry stocked, YOU make this ministry amazing! The pantry is stocked more often now that many of you have accepted the invitation to help with refilling the pantry. Your time and efforts are appreciated. I know God wants us to work together, to invite people to join in with service, and to enjoy the fellowship gained from spreading his love through works of kindness and generosity.



Information for our newest members: You are invited! Feel free to stock the pantry when you notice it needs more items. It doesn't need to be full. In fact, it may be that more visitors are served with

more frequent stocking and fewer items. We should not concern ourselves with how much a person takes, or how frequently they visit the pantry. The supplies are a gift freely given from God's people. Please don't approach anyone visiting the pantry unless it is to say hello or welcome. It's easy for us to make judgments based on the car they drive, their clothes, etc but truth is none of us know the circumstances that brings someone to our door. Please place all donated items on the table In the fellowship hallway. (Gifts for GAP typically are left in the narthex in provided bins.) Please do not fill the cupboards as I try to make sure items are rotated.

Lastly, for those of you who may ask, we are grateful for **bottled water**, food and personal care items such as soap, shampoo, and dental hygiene items. Please continue to pray for those facing food insecurity and all the concerns that arise from this issue. I am happy to answer any questions and open to any suggestions anyone may want to offer. 

Meetings are on the 4th Monday of the month at 11am unless otherwise noted.




Join us on Monday, April 28 at 11am in the Adult Sunday School Room as we meet to discuss the book, "The Women" by Kristin Hannah.
